PART 2 : READING COMPREHENSION

Read the following passage carefully and then answer questions that follow.

- 1 The Sport of Boxing has had a long history. It began 6,000 years ago in ancient Africa, and spread to Egypt and Greece. Ancient boxing had no ring, no gloves, and few rules. In Greece, two fighters sat on stones and pounded each other on the head until one of them was knocked out.



- 2 Boxing became part of the Olympic Games in 688 B.C. In the games, boxers wore leather strips to protect their hands and wrists. It was simply a marked circle that defined the field of action. Roman boxing was especially brutal and even deadly. In 30 B.C., the sport was abolished and disappeared for more than 1,600 years.
- 3 In seventeenth-century Europe, boxing made a comeback. At first it combined wrestling and bare – knuckle fighting. Boxers grabbed their opponents, threw them to the ground, and it hit them while they were down. There was little technique and few rules.
- 4 In 1719 James Figg, an expert fencer as well as a boxer, opened a boxing school in London. He helped boxers develop skill in sidestepping,

counterpunching, and quick movements.

- 5 A set of rules were drawn up, and eventually boxing became so popular that English gentlemen took up the sport. Early boxing had no set rules. Today there are standard rules for boxing that define what boxers can and cannot do.
- 6 Rules in amateur boxing are different from rules in professional boxing. They are designed to protect the boxers. For example, professional fighters earn points for knocking down on knocking out their opponent's target area. Knockdowns and knockouts do not earn points. Amateur rules also apply to women's boxing.
- 7 Mild injuries, such as small cuts or bruises, happen in all boxing events. During a professional contest, a fighter's injuries can be extreme. A bout is stopped only when a boxer is knocked out or can no longer continue. In amateur boxing, the contest ends when bleeding or swelling around the eye limits a boxer's vision.
- 8 There is also a difference in the number of rounds allowed. In early boxing, an event could last as long as 30 rounds. In 1880, challenger Paddy Ryan defeated English champion Joe Goss after 87 rounds. Today a professional fight is limited to 12 three – minute rounds. Women boxers are allowed three two – minute rounds. Contests for boxers under the age of seventeen are even shorter.
